It seems that every so often a great tragedy has to occur. One such took place last week when the LaSalle hotel at Chicago burned with a loss 56 lives and over 200 persons injured. This building was erected 37 years ago and rated fire proof. However the state fire marshall says he left them a list of 10 improvements to make on his last inspection, none of which were complied with. After this disaster Chicago police got busy and closed two theatres and 5 night clubs who were not complying with state fire laws. The memory of the Hotel Kern fire at Lansing is still fresh in the memory of Michigan people and there is no assurance a similar tragedy might not occur,
