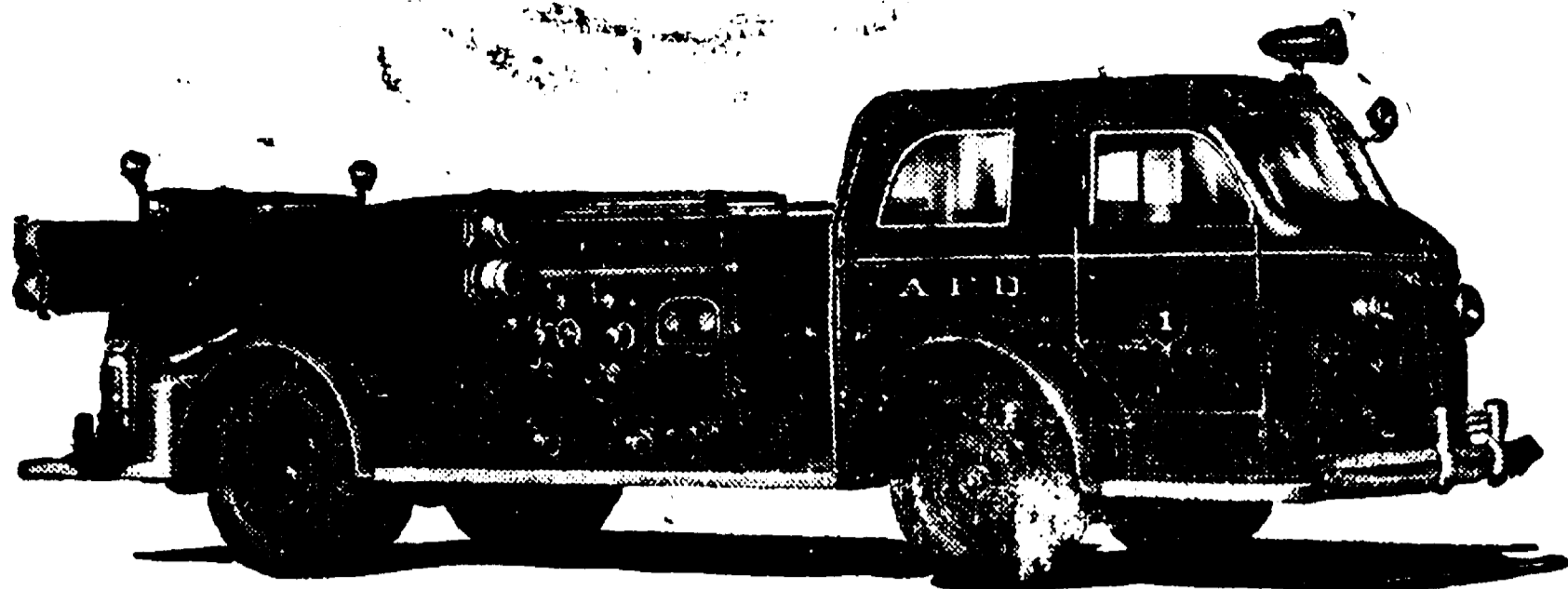

Community Fire Truck

About one year ago, the residents of Putnam Township, realizing that the Township had no fire equipment of its own and that it had to depend on the old fire equipment owned by the Village of Pinckney for fire protection, made a survey of available fire equipment which would be adequate to serve the Township and surrounding communities; the equipment decided upon was built and sold by the American LaFrance Company. The price of this equipment at the time was \$12,000.00. Petitions were accordingly circulated for the purpose of having the proposition of buying this fire equipment submitted to the voters of Putnam Township for approval or rejection; at the Nov. 1946 election, the proposition was approved and the Township was authorized to spread a general assessment to raise the sum of \$12,000.00 for the purchase of fire equipment. However, during the time it took to have the proposition submitted to the voters at the Nov-

election the price of the equipment increased by \$2,000.00 making a total cost of \$14,000.00. The township has entered into an agreement with the Township of Dexter and Hamburg whereby the Township of Putnam agrees to furnish fire protection to Dexter and Hamburg Townships at a fixed rate per run.

Having in mind that when it comes to fire fighting equipment the best, fastest and most efficient equipment obtainable is the only equipment to own when long runs have to be made, it being common knowledge that unless the equipment can reach a fire in the shortest time possible, the fire damage may be very extensive both to the property on fire as well as to the surrounding property and there being no fire engine available for the amount of money appropriated, the Township must either buy smaller equipment or the equipment which costs \$14,000.00 and in order

to obtain the better and more efficient equipment the sum of \$2,000.00 will have to be raised by popular subscription. The equipment now on order is the most modern and efficient and as far as it can be ascertained, will be one of the best and most efficient fire engines available by any community between the City of Detroit and Lansing.

The opinion of many people who reside in the various townships is that the better equipment should be purchased and that the additional money necessary should be donated by the residents of Hamburg and Dexter Township. Some time in the near future the residents of both Townships, will be asked for contributions for the purpose of raising the additional sum of \$2,000.00 which is necessary to purchase the equipment which is described in the cut of the equipment appearing in this paper.

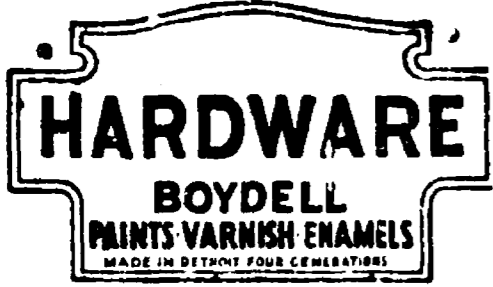
