

Now this does not mean exactly what it says. Mich. State will now have to be investigated by a three man comme to see if their athletic system is in order. lnasmuch as the Big Nine colleges already have their schedule made up for several years in advance it will be that long before Mich. State is given a place on their slate. We are amused at a number of letters appearing in the papers that Mich State should not have been admitted because there are not enough football players in Mich for two Big Ten teams. Of course, there are not.In fact there never were enough for one team and, for that reason not over a quarter of the U. of M. players come from Michigan The rest are recruited by alumni from every state in the union. 


