The governor would cure the tax situation by a corporation pro tits tox. He say no constitutional convention until the state is reapportioned. Furthermore he says it would take until 1954 before it could accomplish anything. First a majority of all voters must approve it. Then delegates must be selected. The delegates would meet and take many months and maybe a year in rewriting the the constitution. Then said constitution must 1 e submitted to vote of the people for approval. He says the state cannot wait that long. The governor will veto any bill that takes junds away from schools or loce 1 communities.. He quotes Supt. o. Instruction Thurs ton who says the schools need \$400,000 to bring the system up to date.

33 states now have a corporat ion prout tax. Trus measure would net \$60.000.000 a year after the tranchaise tax vas taken out. It has 3 advantaces. 1. New busiiness would not have to pay it until it begins to make money. 2. **Sm**all busine 3 corporations pay more under the franchaise tax. 3.Many smal businesses are not incorporatea.






