MICHIGAN MIRROR CHRONOLOGY

Police and state officials are pounding on themes of highway safety. For the third year in the last 10 more than 2000 have been killed in Michigan traffic and law officers admit they are puzzled. Despite the curbs on reckless driving, such as speed zones, educational campaigns, extra patrols, use of the National Guard and the new safety devices on autoes the traffic death toll continues to rise. Now police cars are to be equipped with cameras. The December toll was 88 less than last year but the toll of 208 in November was way out of proportion.

Supt. Childs of the State Police blames the drivers. He says if they would obey all the traffic laws the number of accidents would be small. Unfortunately they will not.

Both the University of Michigan and Michigan State are studying the accident problem. Dr. Muehlberg of the crime prevention bureau says 40 % of the accidents involve persons who drink. Also there was a 16 percent increase in the ownership of cars last year. Michigan now has 3,900,000 cars on the highways. The legislature in Gov. Williams special session made a start by setting up speed limits, adding 200 new state policemen and appropriating \$25 per pupil for driver's education in the public schools. More proposals will be presented to the present legislature, one of which is medical tests for drunk drivers.

Educational needs will also be stressed. The 52 member commission will disseminate information received at the recent White House Educational Conference. Michigan has also appropriated \$150,000 for an educational study.

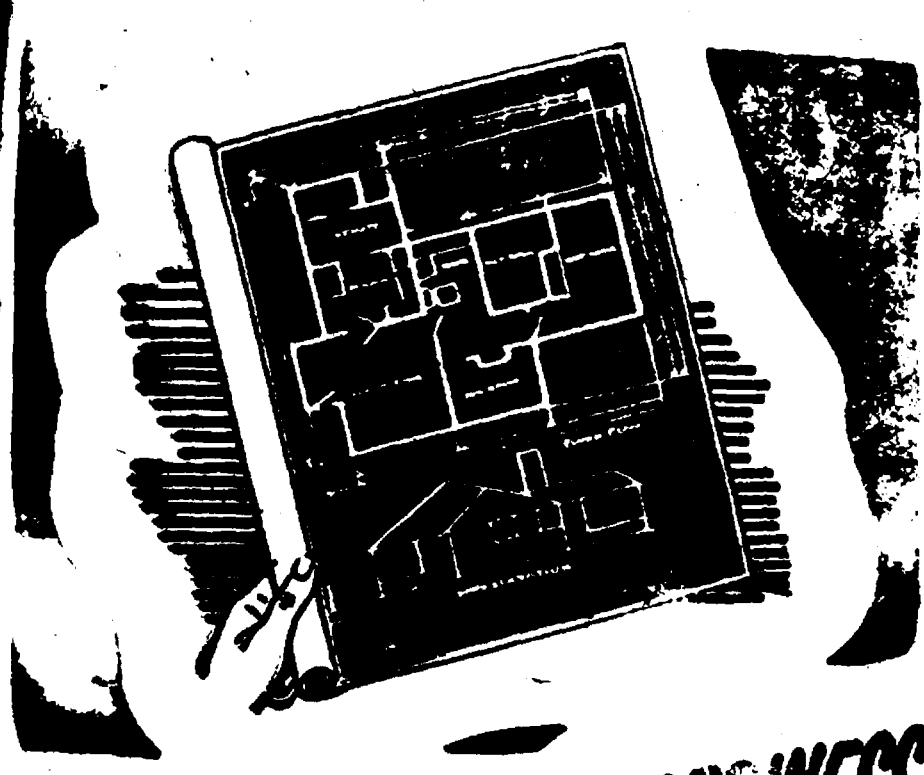
