MICHIGAN MIRROR

The state budget-for next year is \$325,000000 but other funds such as two thirds of the state sales tax Will run it up to \$750,000. The small er figure is the states working cap. the schools.

The 2,000,000 for the purchase of Salk vacine is still intact. The dead line was extended from Feb. 29 to June 30, 1957.

The pension plan to pay legislat. ors \$2.000 a year and their wives the same was killed. It passed the house 83 to 22 but ran into a snag in the senate. It would have been financed by a 2 percent tax on their salaries. A legislator gets \$4000 a year plus a \$1000 expense account. A bill to raise their salary to \$5000 a year was killed.

Tr legislators are Still passing the buck on the right to control the deer herd. It was buried in comm ittee once, revived, then passed with session and maybe not then.

The legislators were unable to agree on many things and many bills died in committee Among them were the ones to deprive the governor of the power to appoint a U.S. senator in case of vacancy. forbid union political contributions, restore 2 license plates to cars, and capital punishment and extend the terms of legislators from 2 to years. The last bill may come up again as a move to reconsider carried but its chances of passing is slight as all Democrats and some Republicans are against it.

ASK WATER LEVEL SET

The property owners at Base lake met at Newport Beach with Drain Com Flook of Washtenaw county to map out a plan to get a water leval for the lake. High waters of the spring do flood damage while in the summer the waters recede too much. Com Flook outlined the law. A majority of the lake property owners must petition the board of supervisors in the counties where the lake is located. The board orders the prosecutor to start suit in court to have the judge set a lake level. Before he can do this surveys have to be made and engineer's estimates as to cost made and an assesment district set up. This was done in the case of Portage Lake and Judge Breakey set a water lavel to be maintained by dredging the Huron River outlet and building a dam to cost \$150,0000. The dam was never built or the river deepened but a stone dam was put in which has to be removed every spring.
