Future revenue: might also be reduced \$20 million a years. This stems from a recent sup reme court decision that the Eastern Pipeline Company cannot be con sidered operating in Michigan and is not subject to the state franchaise tax. Now tthe United States Supreme Court has refused to review decision which affirms it. The court held the company is not required to pay a tax on gas produced elsewhere and piped into Michigan.
