A school "That Nobody Wants" now finds that it has many friends. This is the Boy's Vocational School at Lansing. The state for 40 years has been trying to move the school from Lansing but has aways ran in to roud blocks. They bought land for it in 1926 but diverted it to oth er uses. Three years ago they asked \$500,000 for a new school but the legislature turned them down. Last year the legislature gave them an appropriation and they bought - . site in Green Oak township because it was near Detroit where most of the boys came from Also close to University of Michigan hospital. Whereupon residents of that com... munity led by real estate dealers and banks staged a protest on the grounds it would decrease proper ty values.

Now the City of Grayling wants the school located there. They prom ise unlimited space, lower property values, construction, , maintenance ecsts and the Traverse City hospital is only 45 miles away.

C. H. Runciman, chairman of the state welfare commission is not in sor of the Grayling location the wants it nearer Detroit. He says one of the greatest influences in rehabilitation is visits from their folks.. This would not be possible if it were located at Grayling. The commission will try to get an ap. propration to build the school this year which the property owners in the Green Oak section will try to kill. Those opposed do not seem disposed to consider what would be the best or the boys.
