Winter Storage of Plant Food Assures Supplies for Spring

THE Middle West Soil Im-provement Committee lists five suggestions for storing fer-tilizer on the farm this winter so it will be in good condition when it is needed for spring

crop operations: 1-Keep the fortilizer bags off the ground or off concrete; 2-Store the fertilizer in the barn or some other dry building; 3-Put the bags on 2 x 4's or crib bing above the floor. Then the fertilizer won't soak up mois ture and get lumpy; 4-Prevent caking by piling bags only sey en or eight high: 5-Keep brok en bags separate from the main pile. Loose fertilizer sieks u moisture
