The legislature appropriated a sum in 1907 when Fred Warner of Farmington was the governor. He had served in the state renate and got acquainted with George W. Teeple, Pinckney-banker, also serving in the senate He ap. pointd Mr. Teeple to the State TB noard and he was elected weasurer of the board and served until 1912. The other board members were most ly doctors. Little was known about the treament of TB then. The treat ment was rest, plenty of fresh air and a diet of milk and eggs. A mush ber of places submitted locations for the san.tarium. Thomas Birkett Dexter banker, submitted the old Dexter homestead now the home of Dr Alex Ruthven and Peach Mt. where the University has their ovservatory and broadcasting station. A mass meeting was held at the Dex ter opera house, I was there Many present were opposed to having it located there as they considered TB contagious. TB board arrived by train at Dexter and rented a 4 seated carryall from the livery tarn to ride around and see the sites offered The Dexter homestead was reject. ed as not having enough elevation and being too near the village for expansion Peach Mt. was given serious consideration but finaly rejected it was said because the lake was on the wrong side of the road. Howell was chosen because it had enough elevation and was far away from a settlement. Mr. Teeple was the only Livingston county man on the board. 
