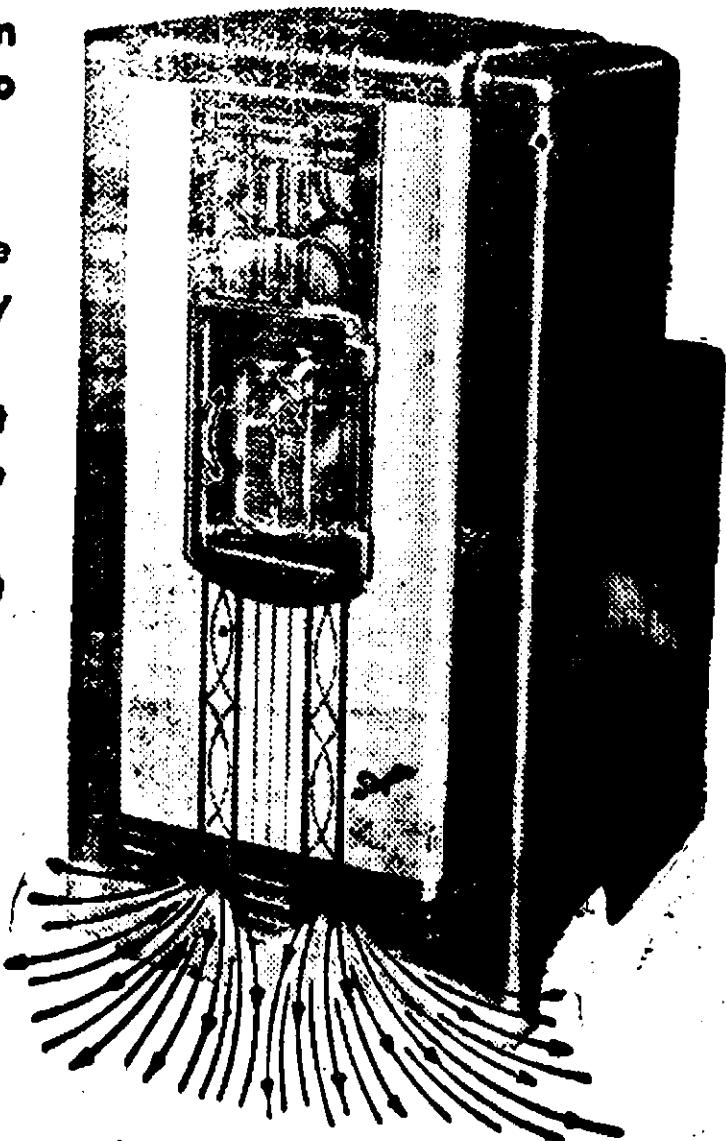

Fall-Fed Pastures Give More Grass, Extra Proteins

CATTLE can have extra days of grazing this fall and an earlier start on fields next spring when permanent pastures are top-dressed with fertilizer this fall, reports the Middle West Soil Improvement Committee. Fertilized pastures get off to a quicker start in the spring and usually produce more grass per acre and more protein per pound of grass, according to studies by Midwestern agronomists. Some agronomists say that application of fertilizer is preferable to spring applications in many respects, because of the farmer's saving for trucks and spreaders. Earlier pasturing in the spring on fall-fertilized fields can mean important savings on feed bills. Bluegrass stays palatable later in the summer when it is well
