### Notes of 25 Years Ago

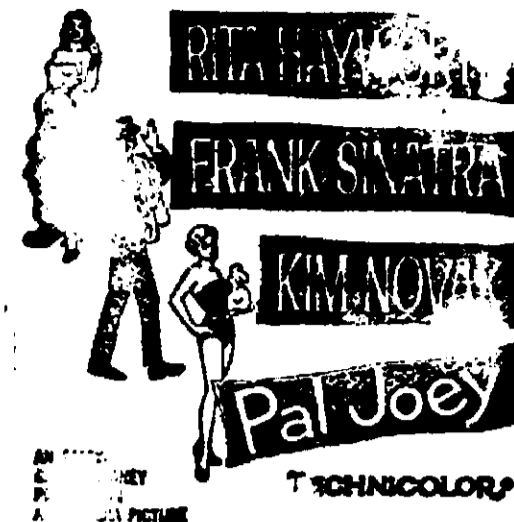
